Early Years Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure by item/project Plan 2018/2019

Early Years Pupil Premium funding is allocated to schools as additional funding which is intended to ensure that underlying inequalities between children who are eligible for free school meals and/or are 'looked after' by the local authority are addressed.

At Moat Farm Infants, 23% of our Nursery pupils are in receipt of Early Years Pupil Premium funding.

Early Years Pupil Premium funding is allocated to schools by the government and schools themselves decide how to spend it. At Moat Farm Infants our motto is '...every day we learn, achieve, have fun and play' and we believe that all children have the potential to achieve at all levels. We therefore use our allocation to help raise standards and narrow the attainment gap by increasing rates of progress for those children in receipt of the EYPPG, so that they are at least in line with their peers.

<p><i>Action: Use of additional LSP to lead Talk boost sessions for EYPPG children.</i></p> <p>Baseline assessment data tells us that 'Communication and Language' is one of the poorest areas of the EYFS on entry to in Nursery this year</p> <p>Listening & Attention Aspect - 71% of the cohort are 'below' the ARE (age related expected levels) and 23% are 'well below' the ARE.</p> <p>Understanding and Speaking Aspects – 58% are 'below' and 29% are 'well below'</p> <p>Research tells us that children's language at the age of 5 is a significant indicator to success in later years at school and overall life chances. We need to close the word gap between our EYPPG and non-PPG children through specific interventions and increased adult led sessions.</p>	<p>£1670</p>
