Spring Term

Overview

We begin our term by learning to read and write poems and stories. We also start our topic called 'The Blitz' which is about World War 2. We will learn about significant events and people such as Winston Churchill. In Science, we will be learning about forces and compare how different things move. This links to our DT topic where we will explore and use wheels, axles and axle holders. We will finish the term by learning about British Values and Easter. Special weeks involve poetry week and World Book week. We will also be holding a maths workshop for parents.

British Values

- Gymnastics - the children will be learning about different types of rolls and creating a sequence of moves.

Science



Scientific enquiry:

- We will creating a weather station to monitor rain and temperature.
- Children will take part in a Science week and will carry out a range of investigations

Maths



The children will be learning to:

- Multiplication (2, 5 and 10 timetables) and division
- Multiplication and division inverse problems
- Fractions of shapes and dividing numbers using place value (recognise the equivalence, one half is the same as two quarters)
- Solving word problems involving all operations (+ - x ÷)
- Measure word problems involving time
- Capacity
- Data handling interpreting and comparing data

English



The children will be learning about:

- Non-fiction texts - reading history books and writing their non-fiction book about World War 2. Children will also write post cards from the view of an evacuee
- Traditional tales - children will be role-playing stories, learning about the features of traditional tales and writing their own version of 'George and The Dragon'
- Recount on World War 2 day.
- Instructions on how to make soup - 'Digging for'

Religious Education



The children will be learning about:

- Parables
- Easter symbols and how it is celebrated.
